PETITION FOR INTERVENTION BY NEW HAMPSHIRE PRESERVATION ALLIANCE AND THE NATIONAL TRUST FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION

NOW COME the Petitioners, the New Hampshire Preservation Alliance ("Alliance") and the National Trust for Historic Preservation ("National Trust") and respectfully petition the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee ("the SEC" or "the Committee") to grant leave for the Alliance and the National Trust to intervene in these proceedings pursuant to New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules, Site 202.11, and RSA 541-A:32. In support of this petition, the Alliance and the National Trust state the following:

1. The Alliance is a 501(c)(3) non-profit preservation organization that is organized under the laws of New Hampshire and headquartered at 7 Eagle Square, Concord, New Hampshire.

2. The National Trust is a congressionally chartered 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, 54 U.S.C. § 312102, which is organized under the laws of the District of Columbia and headquartered at The Watergate Office Building, 2600 Virginia Avenue NW, Suite 1100, Washington, D.C. 20037. The National Trust has a Field Office in Boston at 7 Faneuil Hall Marketplace, Boston, Massachusetts, 02109.

3. The New Hampshire Preservation Alliance, established in 1985, strengthens communities and stimulates local economies by encouraging the protection and revival of

historic buildings and places. Throughout our 30-year history, we have worked to revive buildings, healthy downtowns, and to protect vital landscapes throughout the state. We strive to demonstrate that historic preservation is an integral part of new economic and environmental trends and that community development and environmental sustainability are compatible with historic preservation practices. We do this through strategic coaching, technical assistance, planning grants, workshops, training, an easement program, and other services. We regularly communicate with approximately 5,000 members and supporters in New Hampshire. We work with approximately 100 preservation initiatives each year, and named rural agricultural landscapes to our *Seven to Save* list in 2014. We are actively assisting preservation projects in towns along the proposed Northern Pass route including Ashland, Boscawen, Concord, Dixville, Lancaster, Stark and Whitefield.

4. The National Trust for Historic Preservation, chartered in 1949, 54 U.S.C. § 312102, is a privately funded nonprofit organization that works to save America's historic places. From our headquarters in Washington, D.C. and our field offices around the country, we take direct, on-the-ground action when historic sites are threatened. Our work helps build vibrant, sustainable communities. Our congressional mandate is to "facilitate public participation" in the preservation of sites, buildings, and objects of national significance or interest. We advocate with governments to save America's heritage, and we strive to create a cultural legacy that is as diverse as the nation itself so all of us can take pride in our part of the American story. We have 800,000 members and supporters, and nearly 1,200 of our members live in New Hampshire.

For decades, the National Trust has worked throughout New Hampshire on preservation advocacy projects, and for the last thirty years, frequently in partnership with the New Hampshire Preservation Alliance. Seven New Hampshire hotels participate in our Historic Hotels of America Program, one of which is potentially within the viewshed of the proposed project.¹ Nine Main Street America communities² are located in the state, including one in Colebrook. In 2015, the National Trust selected Scenic Landscapes of New Hampshire as a National Treasure in direct response to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line. Our National Treasures program is a portfolio of irreplaceable, threatened places of national significance where the National Trust is making a long-term, deep organizational investment. Through this program, the National Trust has an opportunity to demonstrate the value of preservation and utilize our more than 60 years of experience, to take direct action to protect these places and promote their history and significance.

5. Both the Alliance and the National Trust have been involved with the proposed Northern Pass transmission line since at least 2011, including, but not limited to:

- A. Participating in the ongoing US Department of Energy's National Environmental Policy Act review for the issuance of a Presidential Permit for the Northern Pass Transmission Line.
- B. Participating as consulting parties in the Department of Energy's review under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, 54 U.S.C. § 306108, 36 C.F.R. Part 800.

C. Participating as a member of the public (to date) in SEC proceedings related to the Northern Pass Transmission line.

6. This Petition is filed in response to an application by Northern Pass Transmission, LLC and Public Service Company of New Hampshire d/b/a Eversource Energy ("Applicants"), on October 19, 2015 to construct, operate and maintain an approximately 192-mile transmission line from Pittsburg to Deerfield ("the Proposal").

7. The New Hampshire Preservation Alliance brings specific expertise related to the historic and cultural resources of the state and knowledge of the communities and people along the proposed route.

8. The National Trust brings more than sixty years of experience and expertise related to the identification and assessment of historic and cultural resources, archaeology, historic and cultural landscapes, heritage tourism, and the economics of historic preservation.

9. The Alliance, the National Trust, and their members' interests, along with people who live in or visit the Main Street communities and Historic Hotel, will be directly affected by the Proposal, including its impacts to the historic, cultural, archaeological resources, cultural landscapes, scenic byways, traditional cultural properties, recreation, and heritage tourism of New Hampshire. The Alliance and the National Trust have a legitimate interest in participating in the proceedings and can offer a unique and expert perspective on the aforementioned issues.

10. The Alliance and the National Trust both have significant expertise and a record of collaborative work with state agencies that can inform the SEC deliberations.

11. Having participated in commenting on the recent revisions to the New Hampshire SEC rules on energy siting and certification, and given our involvement in commenting on both the public aspects of the applicant's proposal to the SEC and the applicant's submissions to the Department of Energy's federal review process related to historic preservation, the Alliance and the National Trust are already familiar with the Proposal. Our participation as intervenors will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings, and would help to serve the interests of justice.

12. The foregoing facts clearly demonstrate that the rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interests held by the Alliance and the National Trust may be affected by the Proposal.

13. Participation by the Alliance and the National Trust as intervenors is unlikely to delay or disrupt the proceedings, but instead will be helpful to the Subcommittee and serve the interests of justice.

REQUEST FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, the Alliance and the National Trust respectfully request that the SEC issue an order granting their petition for intervention and granting such other further relief as the SEC deems appropriate.
