Dear Ms. Monroe:

We respectfully request to intervene in the SEC’s proceedings under Docket No. 2015-06 relating to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line. Per the SEC’s regulations, we are sending this request to you, with copies to the SEC’s distribution list for this proceeding as noted in the “cc” below.

Our particular rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interests that may be affected by the SEC’s Northern Pass proceedings include the following:

Our home at 14 Church Street in Deerfield is within the Deerfield Center Historic District, a district so designated by the National Register of Historic Places. The home is known as the Pulsifer Home and is believed to have been built around 1835. The National Register of Historic Places designation may be found on the National Park Service website, along with photographs and descriptions of our home and the neighboring properties.

The proposed Northern Pass transmission lines will be built on a PSNH right of way within a tenth of a mile—a little more than 520 feet—from our home. The proposed transmission towers will likely be visible—and perhaps audible—from our historic property.

The proposed towers are flatly incongruous with the aesthetic, historic, and scenic values of the Deerfield Center Historic District. The aesthetics of our our property and of the Deerfield Center Historic District, and the value of our home and of our right of quiet enjoyment, will be greatly diminished by the construction and existence of the Northern Pass.
