Enclosed for filing in the above-referenced docket, please find an original and one copy of a revised Exhibit A to accompany Applicants’ Response and Objection to Certain Petitions to Intervene, submitted to the Committee on February 26, 2016. This revised Exhibit A is intended to replace the original filed concurrently with the Applicants’ Response and Objection to Certain Petitions to Intervene.

After reviewing supplemental information submitted by various petitioners the Applicants made the following changes:

1. Charles and Donna Jordan were moved to the Abutting Property Owners category;

3. Carol Dwyer was added to the Abutting Property Owners category;
4. Lisa Wolford and Pamela Hanglin were added to the Non-Abutting Property Owners category;

6. The Town of Clarksville was added to the Towns and Town Governing Bodies category.

The Applicants received supplemental information from a number of additional petitioners; however, as explained below, the Applicants do not feel that said petitioners sufficiently demonstrated why their categorization should be changed.

1. The Heath Road Interveners argue that a deed granting them the right to travel on a right-of-way makes them abutters to the Project. The Applicants disagree. The Applicants’ position is further explained in footnote 1 of Exhibit A.

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2. The Dixville Notch-Harvey Swell petitioners submitted a revised Petition to Intervene in which they argue that they should be categorized as abutters because 6 out of the 42 signatories to the petition own property abutting the Project. The Applicants disagree. The Applicants' position is further explained in footnote 2 of Exhibit A.

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<sup>1</sup> The Heath Road Intervenors jointly own approximately 243 acres of land located a certain distance off of Heath Road in Stewartstown, NH. The deed to the property includes “[T]he right to travel ... over a fifty (50) foot Right-Of-Way...” The proposed Project would cross this right-of-way but not their property. The Heath Road Intervenors claim that this interest makes them abutters to the Project. The Applicants assert that a right to travel on a right-of-way is distinguishable from an ownership interest in a property and is insufficient to establish that they are legal abutters.

<sup>2</sup> The Applicants draw attention to the fact that multiple signatories to the Dixville Notch-Harvey Swell Petition to Intervene also petitioned the Committee for intervention in their individual capacities. The Applicants request that the Committee consider the propriety of such redundancies in considering individual and group petitions to intervene. Additionally, to the extent that petitioners have voluntarily grouped themselves, the Applicants request that such petitions be treated as a single petition. The Dixville Notch-Harvey Swell intervenors filed an updated petition to intervene on March 2, 2016, in which they claimed that they should be treated, collectively, as abutting property owners because 6 of the signatories to the petition own properties abutting the Project. However, the updated petition did not explain which signatories own abutting properties. Based on the information at their disposal, as well as the undisputed fact that 36 of the signatories are non-abutters, the Applicants maintain that the Dixville Notch-Harvey Swell intervenors should be collectively classified as non-abutters.
