Public Comment and Alternate Route Recommendation:

The Poore Family Foundation for North Country Conservancy, (with mailing addresses listed

above) are stewards to the 100 acre "Poore Family Homestead District" in Stewartstown NH, an

historic resource that will be directly affected by this project as identified in the original Application

under "Historic and Cultural Resources", of which I am the Executive Director, is opposed to above

ground high voltage power lines and towers, proposed by the Northern Pass LLC, from Hydro Quebec,

Canada and through NH. The proposed transmission corridor will have a detrimental affect to the

"incredible sense of being" one experiences when entering this historic district, and the sense of

"stepping back in time", to "one that existed prior to the rural electrification of the Northern most

regions of New England". The corridor, as proposed, will degrade the region's expansive and scenic
