We are truly very distressed. We have been expecting Northern Pass to fail from their inability to meet the requirements necessary for a permit . And they have certainly been ignoring all the little voices and the more prominent ones such as the Forest Society to rethink their intentions.

We are abutters to a ROW with a small overlap. We were not the original landowners that agreed way back when there was only one line of wires and poles. I'm sure they would turn over in their graves if they knew what it was going to be used for now.

When I eat breakfast and when I go to sleep at night the view out our windows are presently the second set of wires and poles which were put in not too long ago and which we had little warning about. They have bothered me and worried me. Now they plan to put in an 88-foot tower which I can see from the back windows I mentioned above and now will also have an 100-foot tower and a 106+-foot tower out our west window. We have some trees but not tall enough and some of those Eversource plans to cut back because they consider them dangerous to the present lines.

Although I would prefer not to have the new lines at all, I feel they owe it to the abutters to **BURY** the line. If not the value of our home will most definitely go down. We are retired and are counting on the value in our home to stay afloat. This is not even taking into consideration the quality of our lives in our remaining years.

Please, please think about what this is doing to people who are helpless against the large corporations. Where is the justice?
