Dear Ms. Monroe,

Thank you for your reply to the Ammonoosuc River Local Advisory Committee's (ARLAC) letter of comment for SEC Docket No. 2015-06.

In answer to your question, ARLAC's letter did not refer to an Alteration of Terrain Permit Application.

ARLAC's comments about Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) were based on review of the NHDES Shoreland Application File #2015-02829, which indicated the construction and installation of the towers and their bases would involve an intrusion into wetland and disturbance to the shoreland.

Use of a SWMP, during and post construction, would help prevent erosion, intercept sedimentation, and control stormwater runoff to protect the water quality at the work site and downstream.

Based on my recollection and past meeting minutes, ARLAC members had looked for but did not find information about access roads to bring the heavy equipment and materials to the proposed construction site. Without this information, the location and extent of the proposed disturbance is unknown.

Thank you for the opportunity to participate in the review process.
