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SEC Comments for January 21, 2016 - Sugar Hill

Margo Connors, Select Board, Conservation Commission

Sugar Hill is part of the North Country of New Hampshire. We are part of a region that is recognized for its pristine beauty, spectacular views across open fields and hills to the White Mountains.

Sugar Hill believes that Norther Pass did the right thing in proposing to bury the electrical transmission line through our town and by- pass the White Mountain National Forest.

Despite Northern Pass's constant mantra that they are listening, our tri-town area of Franconia, Easton and Sugar Hill was never consulted before the new project along routes 18 and 112 was announced.

It is our understanding that NH Department of Transportation was not notified or consulted before this route that is now part of the SEC application was proposed.

Northern Pass has not adequately considered alternatives, including using I-93 as outlined by the DOE's Draft EIS in Alternative 4a. They have overstated the barriers to using I-93, presumably because they are still holding on to vestiges of the original configuration. There is no good reason for the North Country and other NH towns to suffer. The SEC should include consideration of alternatives in their decision-making.

Instead of choosing to listen <u>to</u> and work <u>with</u> all the towns along the proposed route, Northern Pass is attempting to divide us into a two tiered array of buried and tower towns. Although Sugar Hill has apparently escaped the damage overhead towers would cause, we recognize and share in the injury that will be done to the many tower and buried towns, to our shared historic landscape, and to our North Country friends and neighbors, and we stand with them.
