I just read that the rate hikes that have been proposed to NH customers are being reconsidered. First of all, we, as consumers, have no say who we use to deliver our power. I live 1/4 mile from the sub station in Deerfield and in all of the major outages over the last decade I have been among the last customers to receive power back. Next, I have endured the construction that has been going on over the last couple of years, with the new high intensity power lines going in, roads being created around the sub station, bar ways being put up, helicopter surveys, increased noise from the high intensity wires, increased travel on a quiet scenic road (not to mention the garbage that your sub contractors throw out the window. I have seen a multitude of companies from different states travel to that sub station for extended periods of work, so the promise of an increase in local employment in BS. Seriously even if there is employment, how long will it be for?) and a definite change in the habits of the wildlife in this area. Now, I should applaud the plan AND pay a higher rate to boot OR be happy that I am not being charged a higher rate. Something is very, very wrong with this plan and the organizers of it. It is an absolute shame that Eversource feels that they can just steamroll though because "they can". There needs to be some very serious reconsideration. As an abutter to this project I have been given zero information from Eversource about their plan, time sched, etc. They never hire details when they are working on my road and they leave it in disrepair. The paved road we got in return for the transformer travel was a joke and lasted a very short amount of time.

NH residents deserve better than this.
