My complaint (beside the ugly high wires) is the amount of noise that will be forever present in this very serene habitat. The amount of decibels the wires will create will be annoying to those of us who love the silence of the area. The wild life WILL be effected over time. You may think the relative decibel level is low at 30, but the reality is that it doesn't belong there. A decibel level of 30 is like having your mother-in-law talking at you 24 hours a day and you can't turn it off! If it reaches 60 everyone should wear ear protection because it will damage your hearing over time.
