Dear Chairman Honigberg and Site Evaluation Committee members,

I am concerned that the current Northern Pass Plan, which claims to want to bring cheap energy to NH people, is creating so much hardship for the very people they are to serve when a viable route down I93 would avoid bringing so much pain, expense, potential injury, and forced relocation to the people they plan to serve.

The Department of Energy Supplement to the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) advises us that buried transmission lines could use the I93 median corridors in place. According to the EIS, such a plan would also bring 3,766 more construction jobs and 544 more permanent jobs. Those wide medians were designed for just such projects in the interests of the general public. The current Northern Pass plan is in violation of all ten conditions the SEC must consider.

A line buried down I93 would also insure that the rent money for that line would go to the State of New Hampshire, not to a private corporation. Such a plan would also demonstrate that the Northern Pass Project wants to show it's appreciation to the State of New Hampshire for allowing the line to pass through the state.

I hope that as a committee, you will choose to do what is best for the State of New Hampshire, not Eversource.
