Dear Ms. Monroe;

I am writing to express my opposition to the Northern Pass Transmission Line Project (Docket # 2015-06).

As I understand the role of the Site Evaluation Committee (SEC), part of the SEC's duty is to ensure new "facilities are evaluated in the public's best interests, and that they are designed, built, and operated in a manner that will protect and preserve the high quality of life enjoyed by New Hampshire's residents and visitors alike."

I also understand the SEC must consider the pressing energy needs of the State of New Hampshire when reviewing projects such as this. I realize New Hampshire and our neighbors here in Northern New England are in desperate need of upgraded and expanded sources of clean energy, but not at ANY cost; and the "costs" of this project are enormous.

After reviewing the paltry information Eversource has published on how this project will benefit New Hampshire and it's citizens, I'm afraid I can find no real benefit to either. I did find considerable benefit for Eversource, however.
