As a resident of New Hampshire I hope the SEC will reject Northern Pass's certificate.

As you have been evaluating and trying to come to a decision as to allow or not allow this project to continue through our state. I too have been investigating into the past. Looking at the effects that these high powered towers with their high powered lines have caused on the people who live near, the wild life that comes into contact, the crops and other plant life, and the havoc that it will cause to the landscape. i don't see any benefit to our state.

I've had real conversations with real people and the only benefit they could find was for the snowmobile enthusiasts.

I've seen, firsthand cancer clusters within groups of people that live in close proximity to these tower lines.

I've heard of incidence in which the electric company is already trying to "buy" support from specific communities, for this project.

I do NOT see any advantage to NH allowing this pass to happen. Please don't close your eyes to the general public and our opinion. The transmission line also will not serve our state, as it merely passes through New Hampshire.
