As a homeowner in Concord and as a citizen of NH and of New England, I am adamantly opposed to the Northern Pass project, from start to finish. It is totally unnecessary and reckless, with no true benefit to the citizens of NH.

In the unfortunate event that the project is approved, it is imperative that the lines be buried for all or certainly for the majority of the way.

Here in Concord, an overhead line would be exceedingly and unacceptably disruptive. It would be environmentally disastrous and aesthetically detrimental.

I am certain that a core of Concord citizens will choose to take actions to prevent the project from placing overhead towers within the city limits and outskirts.

I personally would be willing not only to petition vigorously against the construction and placement of the towers. but I would also be more than willing to participate in protests of a peaceful, not violent, nature, to the point of sitting in to prevent construction. In other words, I feel so strongly against this foolhardy project that I would risk being arrested and jailed to make my point. I am 68 years old so I do not say this lightly.
