

Hello Pamela,

I am sure you are aware of the massive public opposition to the proposed Northern Pass Project. I spoke at a recent SEC meeting in Concord where 34 people testified on a wide range of topics. These ranged from burial ground locations, siting impacts of the massive towers on the landscape, how burial and associated road construction will severely constrict long standing businesses located along the burial route and the weak evidence proponents gave in support of the project on carbon footprint, employment statistics and projections on future energy costs. All 34 citizen statements were passionately opposed to the project.

It has become quite clear that this project will benefit relatively few stock holders and businesses at the expense of degrading our pristine environment and the lives and livelihoods of New Hampshire's citizens living in proximity during and after the construction of this project.

I urge you to please consider the integrity of New Hampshire's natural resources and the majority of its citizens in the permitting process. There are other delivery options for Northern Pass to supply energy to Southern New England. There are no other options for us when our businesses have been damaged and the northern landscape suffers the consequences of irreversible scenic impact.
