Dear Members of the Site Evaluation Committee:

You should reject the proposed Northern Pass project. It does not provide any appreciable benefit to the citizens and property owners of New Hampshire, and it will have many negative impacts. The evidence before you establishes that any electric cost reductions will be microscopic at best. Against this tiny "benefit" at the enormous costs. Damage to the aesthetics of the north country, and to the tourist industry. Damage to wildlife habitat. Traffic tie ups further hurting tourism during construction. Potential water quality degradation.

It will actually cost jobs. If Canadian hydro power is not used to meet the standards for "renewable" energy in Massachusetts and Connecticut, then the alternative will have to be construction of local solar and wind installations that will employ more construction workers over a longer period of time, than northern pass, and income generated will be local.

Finally, the alleged environmental benefits here will be out weighed by the degradation and loss of forest in Canada. Northern Pass is a Lose-Lose project. Please reject it.
