I request that the NH Site Selection Committee not approve the request of Eversource/Northern Pass to construct this project for the following reasons:

- The UNH Carsey Institute 2017 study has shown that New Hampshire produces more than enough energy for local and state –wide consumption needs. The NP project as shown by studies will not seriously reduce the costs of electrical energy in NH, and is being exported to states south of NH for the profit of Eversource and its investors,
- The process of burying the cable through the middle of Plymouth, NH, as well as other towns on NH Rt. 3, will seriously impact the normal functioning of life in those towns and especially Plymouth for a protracted period of time. It is likely that a number of businesses adjacent to the project will lose significant amounts of revenue because of the disruption resulting from the construction, and that loss may be significant enough to cause their demise. Such disruption and its long range economic impact will have a serious, negative effect on the economic and social well-being of the Plymouth area community,
