I find it very surprising that Eversource is stating that jobs will be provided to NH contractors when in fact they are hiring contractors outside of NH to do work along existing power lines that include new infrastructure replacing wooden transmission structures with new steel structures. I received a letter from Eversource on 11/29/2017 stating that contractors from PAR Electrical Contractors and Supreme Industries will be replacing the infrastructure along a ROW that abuts property that I own. PAR Electrical headquarters are from Kansas City, MO and Supreme Industries, a site development company, from Harwinton, Ct. I think IBEW has been sold a bill of goods from Eversource. This is proof that the jobs performed for clearing the ROW, erecting structures and Electrical engineers will not be performed by NH workers. The benefit that Eversource/Northern Pass is promoting for employment opportunities for NH should be eliminated and not be considered as a benefit to NH.

Remember that Eversource/Northern Pass is marketing and providing you with a sales pitch to sell their project for their rewards, not NH rewards. Marketing is not always honest and avoids the truth in order to be sold.
