New Hampshire residents know a BAD thing when we see it. We stop Aristotle Onassis when he wanted to bring in a refinery plant to Great Bay with off loading docks near the Isle of Shoals. According to newspaper accounts, Onassis was looking to build a 400,000-barrel-a-day refinery on Great Bay. Oil tankers would dock at a terminal at the Isles of Shoals, and crude oil would be piped underwater to Rye, then over land to Durham. There the oil would be refined in a plant spread out across 3,500 acres of land on Durham Point.

The story was first covered by a local newspaper called "Publick Occurrences" and publisher Phyllis W. Bennett, reporting that strangers were trying to buy large areas of land under the headline, "An Oil Refinery on Durham Point?"

A local group called Save Our Shores and young housewife Nancy Sandberg rallied residents against the proposal, convincing Durham Town Meeting to reject zoning changes that would have permitted the refinery project to move ahead.

The day after Durham residents voted, state Rep. Dudley Dudley's so-called Home Rule Bill passed during a special session of the Legislature. House Bill 15 would reaffirm the right of individual towns to make their own decisions on large projects - like an oil refinery.

I say we did not destroy our shores AND WE WONT LET OUR FORESTS BE DESTROYED EITHER.
