My wife and I benefit in numerous ways from our community resources that support public education. At Plymouth State College and area public libraries in the Lakes Region we have attended public hearings and presentations on the proposed Northern Pass Project.

What is clear at every discussion of the Pass is the enormous utilization of eminent domain the Project requires.

What is uncertain at every discussion is the facts:

- will NH simply be a conduit for energy to be consumed by other regions; NH itself deriving no lasting benefits for sacrifices its citizens are being asked to bear - speakers saying Yes follow speakers saying No
- has every effort been made to exert the most minimal impact on our landscape and natural resources or has cost been an overriding determinant - speakers saying, ' Yes, we have" are followed by speakers saying, "No, we have not"
- are the proposed benefits supported by hard data or by wishful thinking on the part of the Project's sponsors - Yes statements are followed directly by No statements...

We ask you to exercise your stewardship responsibility by declining to let this project go forward until the evidence in support/rejection of the Pass achieves a level of dependability that the average person is enabled to make an informed decision of its merits.
