Thank you for the opportunity to voice my opinion in opposition to the Northern Pass. I was the former legislative staffer for Senate Warren Rudman, who, with other NH delegation staffers, navigated the White Mountain National Forest Wilderness Act of 1984 through Congress and into law. In the spirit of over 80 interest groups in NH (at that time) we all worked together for two years collaboratively (and at times with great difficulty) to compromise in order to achieve not only a balance of business, environmental, and recreational concerns; but the SPIRIT of the law to protect our precious north country.
