




Whitefield's community character has evolved out of the special way in which the people have interacted with and shaped the natural environment over a period of time, creating a cultural landscape imparting a special sense of place. Examining and inventorying the physical elements comprising the cultural landscape reveals unique differences between communities. Each town's character has been uniquely created as the various social, cultural, and governmental entities have been affected by certain commercial, industrial or agricultural endeavors, as well as by factors such as tourism and transportation.

For the purposes of this study, Whitefield has been divided into two areas of concentration: the outlying areas (#0-#92) and the downtown district (#100-0 - #100-319) with a separate map identifying surveyed resources by number. A short summary of the history of Whitefield will establish the relevant historic contexts in order to properly evaluate and plan for preservation priorities and conservation measures.

Whitefield was settled at the beginning of the 1800's, in sharp contrast to the late 18th century settlement of the surrounding communities which had more direct access to the settler's interstate: the Connecticut River. The population increased from 51 in 1810 to 1015 in 1860, with the great wave of settlers coming to Whitefield in the 1820's. By mid-century, the first wave of settlement on outlying hill farms was well established, with small saw and grist mills set at intervals along the banks of the various streams. District schools and outlying cemeteries marked the locations of relative population density.

What was later to become the village of Whitefield had similar beginnings to the other areas in the town limits. Asa King settled there c. 1813, setting up a saw and grist mill just west of the village bridge where evidence of the sites remain. The abundant waterpower of the Johns River determined this location as the logical site for future commercial development, and by the late 1820's, a store and tavern had been established. The area known as King Square, originally belonging to Asa King, was deeded to the town in 1833 as a "playing ground for boys", at that time still primarily agricultural in character.

By the late 1830's, Whitefield's major enterprises were involved in the lumbering and wood industry. Lands had been cleared for farming and for industry, relying on towns further afield to provide wood for the mills. The most significant event in Whitefield's history was the location there, by 1870, of the Brown Lumber Company, which by 1885 had become one of the major lumber companies in New England. The advent of the railroad in 1870 (built by the Brown Company to reach timber reserves) and further railroad expansion connecting Whitefield to outside markets (Maine Central Railroad, c. 1890) prompted an economic boom that was in full bloom by the 1890's. The expansion of in-

dustry encouraged a building boom, supplying both worker housing and large , stately homes for the various business entrepreneurs. King Square and the downtown district acheived most of the present appearance during this time of great economic activity.

Increased access to Whitefield due to improved transportaton modes brought other changes to the outlying areas of town. The farm economy expanded with the access to new markets. The railroad brought the incredible vistas of Mount Washington and the White Mountains within easy reach of an increasing number of tourists, and the most scenic of the hill farms began to double as mountain inns by c. 1890. Tourism continued, and by the beginning of the 20th century, vacation cottages and large, architect designed second homes for the wealthy began to encroach upon the lands previously given over to farming. As widespread access to the automobile made transportation increasingly easy and tourism a national pastime, roadside cottages and lakeside camps began to proliferate by c. 1940. After the various booms and declines in the mid-20th century, Whitefield has begun to see increased development pressure which threatens aspects of the cultural landscape that have evolved as a result of historical events.

- Religious trends (cemeteries and churches c. 1805 - present)
- Health & Medicine ( hospitals, doctors offices c. 1820 to present)
