Kinder Morgan is abusing our rights. Eminent domain was adopted as a way to expand our country in Early America, ie: roads, railways, water supply lines, and public buildings. Private land was purchased for public use to transport people, goods and ideas to other people and places, so the general public would benefit. A few would sacrifice to benefit all.

It was not meant to forcibly take people's land under severe protest (picketing, class action suits), so that one person (KM) can transport solely their goods (fracked gas) to their place (KM hub in Dracut), without sharing along the way or providing overall public benefit.
