Mr. Honigberg;

In regard to the recent 'public information hearings' required under 162-H:10 specifically the Rockingham County hearing at the Windham High School on December 1, 2015. I wish to raise the following issues....

- 1) Public Notice of hearing was inadequate. No notice was published in the town newspaper.
- 2) Question and Answer period does not allow for follow-up questions
- 3) Questions were sorted and grouped by general characteristic, not every question was answered. (I use the term 'answered' loosely. 'Addressed' is the proper term since most responses were generic in nature and never answered specific questions i.e. *How much savings on electric bills would a typical NH consumer receive with the benefit of the NED pipeline?* Millions!)
- 4) Source of question is not identified. It would be worth knowing what the public is asking and what is 'planted' by Kinder Morgan personnel.
- 5) No committee oversight to hearing. There should at least be an identifiable observer present at the hearing (as FERC does at earlier open houses)

Mr. Honigberg, many of us have attended Kinder Morgan presentations in the past. It is unbelievably frustrating to hear the same misinformation being presented over and over as facts, with little opportunity to correct the record. I suspect your response will be that the next round of hearing will offer some balance. But the start of the process with this committee is little more than a PR opportunity for Kinder Morgan.
