**Subject:** SEC comment for 2015-08 NED gas pipeline.

Hi Ms. Monroe, I am contacting you because as a landowner directly impacted by the proposed NED gas pipeline I am still searching for the part of New Hampshire government that cares about us little people.

The Pipeline people want to put this pipeline just behind my house . My well at 403' deep is only 150 ft. from the propose construction easement. My land was a gravel pit in the 1960s and 1970s so most of the area was stripped to ledge. I am very concerned that the blasting they will need to perform will damage my well . They will also be preventing my land from being used as house lots for my children as well as destroying the trees and value.

Why does the pipeline need to be the so large ? New Hampshire will use very little of the gas that flows through the pipe . Even New England's use will be less than 1/2 of the capacity. Why do we have to support export of the gas?

How much less would the negative environmental, public health and safety, socioeconomic impacts be if the capacity was sized right for NH or New England?

Eminent domain should not be for corporate gain!! Only for betterment of New Hampshire.
