Subject: Kinder Morgan deception

Dear Mr. Morse,

I just read the New Hampshire Union Leader's article, "Senate president expresses opposition to pipeline project" by Dave Solomon and want to extend my thanks to you for taking a position against the NED pipeline.

Of all the things that are wrong about this proposal, I am especially troubled by Richard Wheatley's quoted email statement:

"We remain open to working with Senator Morse, as well as other stakeholders in New Hampshire and other areas, consistent with our stated goal to help bring more natural gas capacity to New England to meet the increasing demand seen for the clean fuel by natural gas and electric distribution companies."

I believe the continuing effort to describe fracked gas as "clean" fuel is a deceptive marketing practice to mislead the public into thinking there are no environmental or health impacts from fracked gas. I believe Kinder Morgan and Tennessee Gas Pipeline are fully aware of the dangers of the hazardous materials inherent to fracked gas pipeline operations and intentionally avoid public transparency of these hazards.

The FDA demands pharmaceutical manufacturers to disclose known and suspected harmful effects of products that will be used on or in the human body.

I believe it is imperative for the FDA to require similar disclosure of the known and suspected hazards of the harmful substances dispersed from fracked gas pipeline operations on and into our bodies. The release of these substances is indiscriminate, unmeasured and impossible to track or control the path through air, soil and water. It is also impossible to measure the exposure to a mobile population and there is no method in place to warn people of entering a danger zone. There is no method to protect or avoid the danger zone or what level of hazard is present at any given moment in any particular spot.

As you can see, these operations are impossible to make safe and therefore, these operations should not be permitted.

It is a major flaw in our current legal system that we must be forced to consume these poisons. These toxins will be released upon us day and night despite our objection to consume them. I perceive this forced intake to be a criminal and torturous act and a direct violation of my right to live a peaceful existence within my home.

People who live near compressor stations and suffer noise and toxic fumes become imprisoned in their homes in an attempt to escape yet testing has found the toxins become trapped in their homes and accumulate to levels far, far beyond what is safe, which is certainly not clean.

I commend your statements of resistance and urge everyone to prevent the tragedy that NED threatens to impose upon us.
