Subject: SEC Rulemaking

We are residents of the Town of Temple and have spent the last year and a half working to protect the health and well being of the residents of Temple and neighboring towns given the plans to construct a 41,000 HP compressor station for the NED pipeline within sight of our elementary school and dozens of residences. We are appointed members of the Temple Adhoc Pipeline Advisory Committee and Temple's representatives to the NH Municipal Pipeline Coalition. We have attended and testified at many legislative and Committee hearings on pipeline matters and spoke with experts from around the country on the health impacts of these facilities. We have also met with FERC representatives who consistently said that protection of human health is the responsibility of the states and not the federal government. We attended two sessions with DES and learned that they do not have the experience or resources to assess in advance or monitor the impact that these facilities would have on human health.

We fully support the proposed SEC rules which will serve to protect the health and well being of New Hampshire residents in the likelihood that another high pressure gas pipeline is proposed for our state.
