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Mr. Evans and Ms. Carmody, my husband and I are abutters to Antrim Wind Energy's turbines. A friend just asked if the noise issues from the turbines have been resolved and I answered that it definitely has not. They pointed out that there were no complaints to the SEC about any noise issues. Due to that communication, I felt the need to send this email. Most of us living close by are waiting to see if the SEC will require testing done according to the parameters that were constantly mentioned during the SEC hearings or not. We feel that the complaint issues that already have been raised have not been addressed and there is no point in filing any more complaints. Personally, my very first noise complaint was never addressed. I was asked to report to Ms. Munroe when it was particularly loud and I did, even sending graphs produced by an app on my phone, but nothing ever happened with that. Our neighbors, Josh and Amanda Bucco, did file report to the SEC, and were disgusted at how the situation was handled. Testing was done under what was supposed to be similar circumstances, but definitely was not. While a neighbor down the road, Shelly Ivy actually called the police one time last summer I believe and was demanding that they come out and address the horrendous noise. The police would not come, and he was actually quite upset about it. A few days ago a friend posted on Facebook showing thunderclouds over a lake in Washington, NH. I replied that the windmills were really loud right now, here in Antrim and that we probably were going to have a thunderstorm. In response to my reply, a person who lives 1 1/2 miles away responded, "Yes, they sure are!" What is my point? My point is that we are definitely still bothered, most of us have lost all hope that the SEC cares or will do anything to help us. We are just little people, who bought property (before the windmills were here) in a very quiet rural area and now we have this noise which no one really seems to care about. Is there any point in filing noise complaints? Is it even possible to "replicate the conditions"? Will you require them to do honest testing? I don't know, but please do not assume since we have not filed recent reports that we are all "happy" over here. We definitely are not, all we are are is totally discouraged that no one cares, and waiting to see what, if anything, the SEC finally does to help the citizens as opposed to AWE.
