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Dear Chairwoman Martin and Committee Members,

Thank you for the opportunity to testify before your Committee today. Attached is my testimony delivered during the meeting.

The one item not discussed was the transparency and timing of correspondence being posted on the SEC website. As described in my testimony, this issue can be very simply rectified by posting correspondence in a timely manner and properly showing the date the correspondence is posted.

I feel compelled to further explain the concerns with the protocol put forth by Tocchi and Acentech. Both these firms are insisting the sound study needs to provide for the sound to be averaged over a one hour interval. Given the variable nature of the sound from wind turbines (whoosh, whoosh, whoosh), this approach will provide for a completely inaccurate result, as compared to the Rules based requirement for a 'do not exceed' measurement, which is reflected by the 1/8 second interval stated in the SEC Rules. The Tocchi/Acentech approach would be similar to being pulled over for speeding and trying to convince the police officer you weren't speeding because you were going 55 MPH for 50 minutes prior to being pulled over with a clocked speed of 110MPH in a 70MPH zone! Good luck with that argument! This is the same situation the AWE neighbors are faced with and the reason they are unwilling to accept this flawed protocol.
